TELL HUNTER MILL DISTRICT SUPERVISOR WALTER ALCORN THAT FAIRFAX COUNTY SHOULD NOT RE-OPEN THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AFFECTING RESTON'S OPEN SPACE

Supervisor Alcorn needs your help to defeat the Weller Development Co. and War Horse Cities developer-owner's ambitions to change Reston's Comprehensive Plan. Their goal is to create housing developments on the Reston National Golf Course. If they succeed, the Hidden Creek Country Club property will be next.

As reported in Reston Now on December 14, Supervisor Alcorn said, "Earlier this year representatives of Reston National contacted me about their plans for a series of community outreach events concerning the current status and future use of their golf course property. I reminded them that the Fairfax County Comprehensive Plan clearly designates this property as a golf course, and my long-standing position that unless and until communities surrounding the golf course indicate their desire to initiate a change in the Comprehensive Plan I will oppose any such change. Community outreach by property owner representatives continues, and I look forward to hearing more from surrounding community members."
